**Information for people thinking about applying
for Tomorrow's Leaders 2010**



Here is some information you might find useful if you are thinking about applying for the next Tomorrow's Leaders course.



This time the course is for self advocate leaders from Inclusion North member areas only. This course is being paid for through your Partnership Board's membership with Inclusion North.

Below are some things that people often ask about. Hopefully this will help you decide if you want to apply for the course and what you write down in your answers.

Who is the course for?

The course is for self advocates who are already a leader in their area. You might do this by being a member of your partnership board or self advocacy group. It might be something else that you do in your area to make things better for people with learning disabilities.



Filling out the application

Tomorrow's Leaders is very popular and not everyone who applies will get on the course. It is very important that you take some time to think about what you write in your application.

Remember that the application form helps us decide who comes on the course. You might want to get somebody to help you do this.



When and where is it?

All the sessions will be held in Durham. We will send you the address if you get a place on the course.



The sessions are on:

- Session 1: 5th October- 1 day
- Session 2: 13th -15th Oct 2010– 3 days
- Session 3: 24th-26th Nov- 3 days
- Session 4: 15th-16th December – 2 days
- Graduation day: 25th January 2011- 1 day



What will happen on the first session?

| On the 5th of October you will:

- ★ Meet everyone who is coming on the course
- ★ Meet and talk to Tomorrow's Leaders graduates who have already done the course
- ★ Talk about what will happen on the rest of the course
- ★ Talk about how to get a mentor



You will also be able to ask any questions you have about the other sessions.

Who could be my Learning Partner on Tomorrow's Leaders?

Everybody will be asked to bring a learning partner. You will need to choose somebody who can commit the time to come to all of the sessions for Tomorrow's Leaders. They will need to support you to get the most out of the course. This will include:



- Helping you take part in the sessions
- Helping you with your homework
- Helping you do a project

They will also need to be somebody who believes strongly in self advocates being leaders.

You and your learning partner will need to come to every session and you will need to be able to stay overnight (we will sort this out for you)

What will it cost?



You will not have to pay anything to come on Tomorrow's Leaders. Your Partnership Board's membership of Inclusion North is paying for this.

We will pay for your travel expenses. You can claim back your travel expenses after each part of the course. We cannot give you money on the day but we will send you a cheque.

We can also organise train tickets for you.





If it is hard for you to pay for any of your travel in advance please phone us.
